Chaplain's Message from Father Oscar H. Frundt

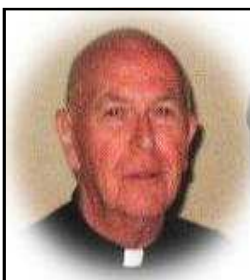
**“ In the name of the Father, and of the Son,

Delaware House Bill No. 20
This legislation limits damages to \$250,000

Delaware House Bill No. 21
This legislation excludes prejudgment interest from damages awarded.

House Bills No. 20 and 21 were introduced on January 25, 2011 by sponsors Rep. Lavelle, Rep. Miro, Rep. Keeley and Sen. Simpson. Co sponsors are Reps. Manolukos, D. Short, George, Mitchell. Sens. Bonini, Sorenson.

This legislation amends the Delaware Code by limiting awards to \$250,000 and eliminates interest from damages awarded.

These bills have been assigned to the House Judiciary Committee. All members of this committee are identified by ** in the House of Representatives listing.

We are requesting all Knights, their families and friends to phone, write or email their Delaware Representatives and Senators to let them know we fully support the passage of House Bills 20 and 21.
