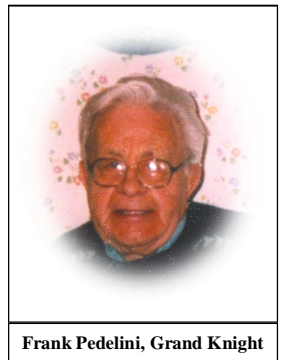
members who would like to serve as an officer, should quickly make his intentions known to **Dominic DiChristopher, Carl Colantuono, or Mike Panfile.**

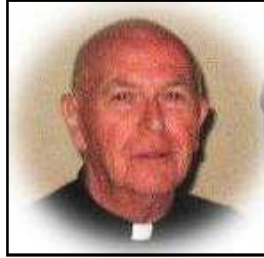

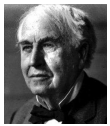
So in our life we must use prayer and worship to help us keep our sanity and do a great job.



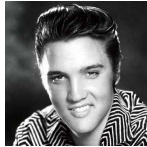

The Polar Bear Plunge that was rescheduled for March 16 at Rehoboth Beach was a rousing success. The group of 70 plungers from the Knights of Columbus, known as the Polar Knights, raised \$21,900.
